Inquiry

Inquiry Big Idea/Question:

Focus:

In this shared inquiry unit, students will explore the concept of responsible citizenship and sustainability by focusing on the wellbeing of people. They will delve into ethical dilemmas affecting individuals and consider the interconnectedness of human and environmental health.

English Reading and Viewing:

Focus: Analysing and critiquing

- Analyse and critique a variety of print and digital sources that allow them to explore different kinds of interpretations and responses.
- Identify aspects of texts that convey details or information about particular social, cultural and historical contexts.

Poetry

- Explore different forms of poetry i.e cinquain, ode and song.
- Identifies the main message/meaning of different forms of poetry.
- Use the acronym SMILE i.e structure, meaning, imagery, language and effect, to analyse poetry
- Identify sound devices in poetry e.g assonance, consonance, alliteration, onomatopoeia

Speaking and Listening

Plan, rehearse and deliver presentations for a defined audience.

English Writing

Informative/ persuasive Writing

- Students construct their own informative text on a chosen Sustainable topic
- Extend ideas through language features
- Determining the purpose of the text and the intended audience
- Use correct text structure and paragraphs to organise writing
- Use of descriptive language using factual and precise adjectives, verbs and adverbs.
- Uses effective topic sentences to inform the reader of what is happening in an engaging way
- Expand vocabulary and language choices and learn about the purpose of vocabulary used in sentences and text
