Religious Education

Topic: Spirited People (Saints)

Children will focus on:

- How the church and school community are part of the family of God.
- The work our parish priest does to support our community.
- How key figures have helped to shape the Church.
- The role we play as disciples of Jesus to help build forgiving and compassionate communities

Topic: Advent

The students will be focusing on:

- How waiting and hoping are important aspects of life.
- The story of Jesus Christ's birth through the gospel's stories.

Inquiry

Inquiry Throughline: Why is it so?

Big question: How does the world work?

Focus: Students will engage in research and the scientific processes to investigate the wonders of our natural and human world.

Student will:

- Question how the world works and 'how and why' things happen, through exploring cause and effect and chemical changes as well as the impact of these on all living things in our world.
- Investigate how the curiosity of scientists
 has helped to develop the world we live in
 today and learn to question, predict,
 problem solve and draw conclusions while
 challenging themselves to justify possible
 ethical solutions.
- Explore wonderings and engage in using the research and scientific processes to find out the answer to their questions.

English

Reading and Viewing:

Students will focus on:

- Reviewing reading and spelling words with consonant and vowel digraphs
- Increasing their phonemic awareness skills through blending, segmenting, and sound manipulation
- Recognising, reading, and spelling multisyllabic words, and words with prefixes and suffixes
- Recognising various persuasive language devices when reading
- Demonstrating their understanding of a text by answering literal and inferential comprehension questions.

English

Writing: Creating texts to inform and entertain readers

Students will focus on:

- Creating persuasive texts that argue a particular viewpoint and give reasons for the argument.
- Learning to experiment with language devices such as emotive language and modal verbs to persuade their audience.
- Using visual memory and or strategies to spell High Frequency Words
- Using punctuation including full stops, commas, quotation marks, and exclamation marks
- Using upper and lowercase letters appropriately

Speaking and Listening:

Students will focus on:

- Identifying spoken language through tone, intonation and the use of facial expression
- Following two and three step instructions containing sequencing words

• Using conjunctions to extend their sentences e.g. 'and', 'so', 'yet'

Mathematics

Number and Algebra:

Focus: Fractions

- recognise and interpret common uses of halves, quarters and eighths of shapes and collections
- link the picture with the symbol and the word for example, one eighth of a cake or one eighth of 8 lollies with 1/8 and the words "one eighth"

Measurement and Geometry:

Focus: Measurement (length and area)

 Compare and order several shapes and objects based on length, area, mass and capacity using uniform informal units (such as measuring the area of a book using the same size blocks)

Focus: Location

 identify, describe and demonstrate quarter, half, three-quarter and full measures of turn in everyday situations for e.g. door handles, choreographed dances, instructions to a location

Statistics and Probability:

Focus: Chance

- identify practical activities and everyday events that involve chance
- describe outcomes as 'likely' or 'unlikely', and identify some events as 'certain' or 'impossible'

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL)

Focus: Help Seeking Students will:

- Practice solving simple interpersonal problems, recognising there are many ways to resolve conflict.
- Identify different ways to care for others including ways of making and keeping friends.
- Discuss the importance of seeking help when dealing with problems that are too big to solve alone.
- Practice seeking help from adults and peers.

Focus: Collaboration Students will:

- Use basic skills required for participation in group tasks and respond to simple questions about their contribution to group tasks.
- Recognise that conflict occurs and distinguish between appropriate and inappropriate ways to deal with conflict.
